Currently, Sunland-Kori Services, LLC is in the process of manufacturing 3 (three) 5060-3020 amphibious undercarriages which will be suitable to mount a 25 metric ton long reach excavator. The manufacturing of these units are near completion and will be scheduled for delivery as needs arise. All of the Sunland-Kori employees are working very well together to ensure that the production of these amphibious undercarriages remains on schedule. Sunland-Kori employees should be commended for their dedication, diligence, and safety focus during the manufacturing process.

Also, Sunland-Kori recently secured a deal for a 4550-2818 suitable for a 20 metric ton standard front excavator to be shipped to South America. We are currently building a 5050-3018 suitable for a 29 metric ton standard front excavator, and this unit should be shipped by the end of November 2019. We also have multiple track refurbishment jobs going on at our Eunice facility. We have also refurbished eight (8) barges in recent months for Sunland Construction's Gulf Coast Division.

This year, what has been your biggest work-related challenge? Blocking out all negativity that could hinder me from doing my work properly.


This year, what has been your biggest work-related achievement? Motivating others to get the job done.

Recently Completed IT Initiatives



- Integrate Adobe Sign with Vendor Requests The vendor application can now be completed and signed using Adobe Sign. This provides quicker response from the vendor and well as more complete vendor information. We will continue to look at other opportunities to utilize Adobe Sign with SharePoint applications.

Windows 10 Tip: Microsoft Action Center

With Windows 10, Microsoft has included an Action Center. Just click the button at the bottom right

corner of the screen to access it. This panel will act very similar to a swipe down on either iOS or Android phones. The top portion of the Action Center will show any notifications that were sent to your computer including emails, setting changes or devices that were connected. The bottom portion will be the Quick Actions section. You can change things like screen brightness, battery saver mode, or turn Wi-Fi or Bluetooth on or off. You can also access the Screen Snip tool to take quick and easy screenshots or make use of the Focus Assist, which will mute notifications so that you can focus on getting work done when time is not on your side from here.

Another new feature in Windows 10 is the Task View. Simply click the icon next to the Start Menu at the bottom of the screen to open it. From here, you can find any app that is currently open and switch to it. If you scroll down, you can also access previous documents or web pages that you were working on. This can be very helpful for those that are busy and have many things open at once, or for quickly accessing a document that you've already closed but now need again. Another neat feature from here is virtual desktops. At the top,

you'll notice a button for "New Desktop". + New desktop Clicking this will completely clean your desktop so that you can start fresh but don't worry, you can toggle back to the previous desktop and everything will still be there! You can go back and forth as needed!
